You can use the latest versions of most browsers, but we recommend [Chrome](#) or [Firefox](#).

Your browser will need to have JavaScript enabled and be able to accept cookies. Most browsers will do this by default.

Windows

- Windows 7, Windows 8, Windows 10 or later
- Intel Pentium 4 processor or later that is SSE3 capable

Mac

- OS X 10.10 or later
- Intel x86 processor

ChromeOS

- Any hardware that will support recent (2019 and later) versions of Chrome

Linux

- Ubuntu 14.04 or later, Debian 8+, openSUSE 13.3+, or Fedora Linux 24+
- Intel Pentium 4 processor or later that is SSE3 capable
